

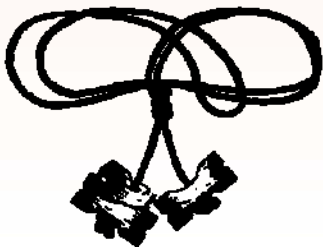
The Wood Badge Tradition

On the morning of September 18, 1919, the 61 year old retired General of the British Army, General Baden-Powell, stepped out into the center of a clearing at Gilwell Park in England. He raised to his lips the horn of a Greater Kudu, one of the largest of African Antelopes, and blew a long sharp blast. Nineteen men dressed with their shirt-sleeves rolled up, assembled by patrols for the first Scoutmasters' training camp held at Gilwell.



Wood Badge SR 946 will continue this tradition of teaching adult leaders skills to lead our youth. Wood Badge for the 21st Century is a continuation of a proud past with promotion of new leadership training skills for the future. Wood Badge for the 21st Century

The objective of a Wood Badge course is to demonstrate as practically as possible the Aims and Methods of Scouting. Six days duration, the course is a multifaceted presentation of leadership skills, organizational tools, and participatory activities based on the best of Scouting traditions and the latest in team-development theory. In addition, participants will enjoy the fellowship of learning alongside many other volunteers and professional Scouters, and along the way we will have a great deal of fun. Upon successful completion of all course requirements and with the completion of your personal "Wood Badge Ticket", each participant will receive a Certificate of Completion, a Wood Badge Tartan Neckerchief, a Leather Woggle and two small Wooden Beads to be worn proudly around the neck.

What is Woodbadge?

Wood Badge is advanced adult leadership training for all adult leaders and volunteers who serve within the Boy Scouts of America. This training is designed to be fun, informative, and helpful for all adult volunteers, Cub Scout leaders, Boy Scout leaders, Crew advisors and professional staff. Most participants find that the lessons and leadership skills learned at Wood Badge are not only useful for Scouting but are also useful in their professional and personal lives.

Who may attend Wood Badge?

Enrollment is limited to the first 48 Scouters to sign up! Attendees may be a Cub Scout leader, Boy Scout leader, Varsity leader, Venture advisor, District volunteer, Council volunteer or professional staff. Space is limited, so make your reservation early.

6 Days...That's a lot of time!

Depends on how you look at it. How much time are you now spending with your Scouting unit? Is it time well spent? Would you like to invest a few days that will teach you advanced leadership skills and techniques so you may lead the youth in your unit better? Are you willing to invest 6 days, plus a few additional hours, to earn advanced leadership skills that will impact you for the rest of your life? This new knowledge helps make your Scouting job more proficient, and your Scouting experience more enjoyable.



Do I have to "Work a Ticket?"

Yes, if you wish to complete your Wood Badge training and earn your "Wood Badge Beads." A Wood Badge Ticket is a simple contract that you write about how you will continue to serve your unit or Scouting position using the principles and skills you have learned at Wood Badge. You write your own personal ticket to help you in your Scouting position. It is not a Master's thesis or a final exam; it is nothing to fear.

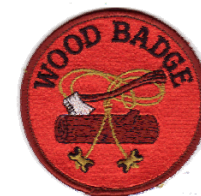
How Much will it Cost?

The total course fee is approximately \$225. A \$50 deposit will hold your place in the course (only 48 participants allowed) and is due at the time you submit your registration. An additional \$75 (\$175 total) is due by May 1, 2009; additional \$50 (\$150 total) is due by August 3rd. The balance must be paid by September 15, 2009.

The course fee covers the cost for food, presentation materials, participants hat and activity shirt. Upon completion of all course requirements, the participant will receive their Wood Badge certificate, leather woggle, tartan neckerchief and their two wooden beads on a leather thong.

What about a Uniform?

A full, complete, and official adult leader uniform of your program (Cub Scouting, Boy Scouting, Venturing) will be worn during the Wood Badge course. Your uniform should be outfitted with the US Flag, home council strip and the international brotherhood patch. Other patches are acceptable (e.g. square knots, OA patches, regional patches, jambo patches, temporary activity patches) to be worn on your uniform. There is no reason to strip the uniform.
